Program: Members of our congregation make casseroles and also volunteer at Our Daily Bread, a soup kitchen run by Catholic Charities, serving a hot mid-day meal to over 800 people 365 days a year.

How to Get Started:

Call Our Daily Bread (411 Cathedral St.) at (410) 659-4000 and ask for the Volunteer Coordinator. She will send you copies of recipes. You can purchase a box of 100 casserole pans at ODB for \$27. Ask your members to sign up to make a casserole once every 3 months, freeze it and put it in your Church freezer on a certain date. If anyone wishes to volunteer to serve at ODB, ask the Volunteer Coordinator which days people are needed (they need 30 volunteers each day.).

Program: Food Bank
How to get started: Ensure that the congregation will support the effort with finances, time, and talent. Find at least 6 people willing to assist. Publicize your intent and get support from area churches, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, schools, Lions, Rotary, and other clubs. If you do not have a building for storage/distribution, you need to rent/purchase a facility. Careful not to get locked into a long-term lease in too small an area - you will probably expand. You need transportation sources to pick up the food, and people to shelve the canned goods in a good order.
